May: Our staff member of the month for May was Rachel from the Creative Room, for working with Jess to get all of the children's folders ready for them leaving and going to school.









Democracy

Within the nursery we ensure that the children are involved in Democratic processes such as voting for the next nursery pet, or what themed party they would like. We use the decision between the room of what activities they would like on the carpet, where they would like to go for a walk and also bring in ideas from home to what they would like to do at nursery.

Individual Liberty

The children are encouraged to begin their independence at Balderton Village Day Nursery. The Creative children have helper badges to become helpers to take on key roles and responsibilities. The children can actively make their own choices, knowing that they are in a safe and secure environment that provides boundaries. We encourage the children to be kind, helpful, respectful and polite to their friends and others.

Mutual Respect

We encourage kind behaviour between everyone, this encourages respect throughout. At Balderton Village Day Nursery we believe that you learn through the relationships you have with others on how you would like to be treated. We join in with fund raising events to support local and worldwide causes, for example 'Red Nose Day'.

Tolerance of Those with Different Beliefs and Faiths

We celebrate and share lots of different beliefs and faiths within the setting. We enjoy doing our 'All About Me' box which shares our own experiences with the others within our room, letting them know our traditions and celebrations. We have children and staff that are EAL, we enjoy learning about their beliefs and faiths, and they also use our resources to promote their learning and integration into the nursery setting.

Rule of Law

We have a clear behaviour policy within the setting for staff, children and parents to adhere by. We, as a team of practitioners review any behaviour incidents within the setting and how it is dealt with. The Creative Room & Explorer Room have 'Happy Day' rules to ensure the room runs smoothly and that they are all kind to their friends. We keep all our rules positive.
